Information for Professionals on MassHealth HCBS Waivers

Acquired Brain Injury Waivers and Money Follows the Person Waivers

- Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waivers are alternative LTSS programs for MassHealth members who otherwise need facility-based care. In Massachusetts, there are ten HCBS Waivers. Each offers specific services to a different target population.
- Four HCBS waiver programs are specifically designed to serve adults who transition from a nursing facility or long stay hospital back to the community:

HCBS Waiver Program	Target Population
1. ABI-RH Waiver Acquired Brain Injury with Residential Habilitation operated by Dept. of Developmental Services (DDS)	Adults with Acquired Brain Injury (ABI) who require 24-hour supervision and staffing in a provider-operated and staffed residential setting
2. ABI-N Waiver Acquired Brain Injury Non-residential Habilitation operated by Mass. Rehabilitation Commission (MRC)	Adults with ABI who do not require 24-hour supports/supervision, but need community-based waiver services provided in their home
3. MFP-RS Waiver Money Follows the Person Residential Supports operated by DDS	Adults who require 24-hour supervision and staffing in a provider-operated and staffed residential setting
4. MFP-CL Waiver Money Follows the Person Community Living operated by MRC	Adults who do not require 24-hour supports and supervision, but need community-based waiver services provided in their home

Could residents of your facility be eligible to participate in an ABI or MFP Waiver? To qualify, an individual must meet financial *and* clinical eligibility requirements:

To qualify for the waiver, an individual must	ABI Waivers	MFP Waivers
Have an ABI* that was sustained at age 22 or older	\checkmark	
Be a disabled adult <u>or</u> be age 65 or older	\checkmark	\checkmark
Have been living in a facility for at least 90 days	\checkmark	\checkmark
Meet clinical level of care requirements	\checkmark	\checkmark
Need available waiver services (see reverse)	\checkmark	\checkmark
Meet financial requirements to qualify for MassHealth Standard**	\checkmark	\checkmark
Be able to be safely served in the community	\checkmark	\checkmark

^{*}Some examples of ABIs that qualify are brain injuries resulting from **stroke**, **brain trauma**, **infection of the brain, brain tumor**, **or anoxia**. This list is not exhaustive. Dementia-type conditions alone do not qualify.

- o Income ≤ 300% of the SSI Federal Benefit Rate
- o Countable assets \leq \$2,000
